REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME - 2019-2020

Scholar Support Programme (SSP),a new initiative in Higher Education Directorate of College Education, Govt. of Kerala was started in our college in the new format in this year. The programme provides a continuous mentoring to the needy students who were academically backward. The programme has besides students mentees, a college level Coordinator ,internal and external mentors. The college has a college level monitoring committee to evaluate the activities of SSP.

Coordinator

Ms. Shruthi Mariam David, Assistant Professor in Mathematics has been selected as the Coordinator of SSP 2019-20 by the college council.

Selection of subjects and students

Eighty students were selected for the programme. Forty of them were from the first year batch and remaining forty from the second year. The subjects for the first year were History, Commerce, Physics, Chemistry & Mathematics. The subjects for the second year were Physics, Chemistry, Botany & Zoology. The selection of subjects was done by college council after considering the result analysis of our college. Students were selected according to the marks and special needs of the students as per the criteria given by the Directorate. Class tutors selected students who need additional support not only from the marks but through personal observation.

Internal mentoring

This was done by college faculty themselves. In this year, according to the guidelines from the Directorate, 5 subjects for first year and 5 subjects for second year were selected. Also there was an internal mentoring sessions on English to all SSP students mentees.

STUDENTS AID FUND / COLLEGE STUDENTS AID FUND

Mahatma Gandhi University/College has instituted a Students Aid Fund. The objective of this fund is to render financial assistance to poor students to meet their tuition fees, examination fees or to purchase books or to meet similar other expenses like study tours etc. Application for the above financial assistance shall be submitted to the College Office.

K.P.C.R CONCESSION

Govt. have awarded educational concession to the students belonging to socially and educationally backward classes in the forward community under Kumara Pillai Commission Report.

At the time of admission, if the student produces the income certificate in the prescribed form from the village officer within the income limit as given below, he/ she will be exempted from paying tuition and special fee

Income limit Degree : Below Rs. 25,000

Post Graduate : Below Rs. 42,000

Immediately after admission they should obtain the prescribed application from the college office and submit the same duly filled in within the stipulated time.

Students who enjoy the KPCR concession will have to produce the income certificate and the renewal application form for the succeeding academic year.

EDUCATIONAL CONCESSION TO O.B.C STUDENTS

O.B.C students with low income are eligible for fee concession. Income limit Rs 25,000 for Degree and Rs 42,000 for P.G. Application along with Caste and Income Certificate should be submitted at the beginning of the course this concession should be renewed every year.

EDUCATIONAL CONCESSION TO O.E.C STUDENTS

Dheevara, Vala, Kudumbi and Christian converted communities are eligible. No income limit. Lump sum grant, stipends and fee concession are available. Application along with caste certificate should be submitted at the beginning of the course.

EDUCATIONAL CONCESSION TO SC/ST STUDENTS

SC/ST students should submit applications to the College Office at the beginning of the course. The scholarship includes lump sum grant, stipend and fee concession.




